Editorial Notes

Technological Education:

In the last issue reference to the state of Technical Education in India was made in the Presidential address by Dr. J. N. Basu. In this issue we publish information regarding Technological Education in the United Kingdom of Great Britain where such education had earliest commencement and we hope that the survey which has been presented to us by the British Information service will prove of benefit to all who are interested in the advancement of Engineering knowledge, and improvement of technical education in India for the benefit of its Industrial development.

It will be noted how much emphasis is laid in Great Britain on the provision of part-time education for those already employed, and how *technical education goes side by side in conjunction with local industries*, and how interest is gaining ground in establishing means for Higher Technical Education and placing of scientific men in charge of administration in Industries.

The advantages, defects, and proposed changes in the system in existence in that country should be closely studied in order to evolve a system best suitable to Indian conditions.
